Small Group Questions

1. We are discussing the little things that Jesus did that mattered in his own life, as well as our life. Jesus honored people. He wants us to do the same. When was the last time you felt like someone honored you? What did they do and how did it affect you? Where do you think we could do a better job of honoring someone in our culture?
2. Read today's passage: **Matthew 8:5-13** *"⁵When Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to him, asking for help. ⁶'LORD,' he said, 'my servant lies at home paralyzed, suffering terribly.' ⁷Jesus said to him, 'Shall I come and heal him?' ⁸The centurion replied, 'LORD, I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed. ⁹For I myself am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I tell this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and that one, 'Come,' and he comes. I say to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." ¹⁰When Jesus heard this, he was amazed and said to those following him, "Truly I tell you, I have not found anyone in Israel with such great faith. ¹¹I say to you that many will come from the east and the west, and will take their places at the feast with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. ¹²But the subjects of the kingdom will be thrown outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." ¹³Then Jesus said to the centurion, "Go! 3. We see honor expressed in three ways:
 - a. How does the Centurion honor his servant? Why is this significant considering his role as a military leader?
 - b. How does the Centurion honor Jesus? Pastor Joel identified two clear ways, but there may be more.
 - c. How does Jesus honor the Centurion?
4. Why does it honor Jesus when we come to him? Why does it honor Jesus when we believe in his authority and say, "just speak the word...?" Do you believe in Jesus' authority in the way the Centurion does? Why or why not? Give examples.
5. Share some simple ways we could honor someone this week in our sphere of influence. Also, share ideas of how we could restore honor in our homes, relationships, country and culture.
