Pathways 1 – Worship: Gather

1. When you think about how God spoke to you through this Sunday's message, what are some thoughts that come to mind?
2. When you hear the word discipleship, what comes to mind? Why?
3. Discipleship: learning to live like Jesus and being transformed to be like Him. React to this definition, how does it strike you and how does it apply to your life?
4. A major section of the message was around the question, "Who is responsible for discipleship?" Read these scripture passages, and go to the end question:
 - a. God: 1 Corinthians 3:6-7
 - b. YOU! Jude 20-21
 - c. The Church: Colossians 1:28

Question 1: How does this affect your view of discipleship/spiritual growth?

Question 2: In your life when you grew the most in your faith, how have you sensed these three things working together?

5. Worship, Belong, Serve and Go. These four words are our Discipleship Pathway. They give direction for our individual journeys in every day of our lives, and they help us craft opportunities for the church.
