'GO' Part 2
October 28th, 2018

1. Do you see evidence that God is doing something spectacular in your everyday life – that is, do you see him at work in your family, your neighborhood, at work, or in your community? Where do you see Him working and what is He doing?
2. The Discipleship Pathway that Westwood is unfolding involves four key experiences: Worship. Belong. Serve. Go. This week Pastor Joel taught about 'GO.' Read Matthew 28:18-20 and answer the following questions related to 'GO.'
Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."
3. What is the heart of 'GO?' What is so important about Jesus' words "It is finished?" What is finished? What begins?
4. What is the fuel of 'Go' stated in Matthew 28:18, 20? What does this mean to you personally and for Westwood collectively in terms of you saying 'yes' to go?
5. What is the scope or reach of 'GO' in Matthew 28:19. Read Acts 1:8. Do you think it's important to go and tell, not just here, but near and far? Why or why not?
6. The 10-10-10 vision is a call for us to embrace Jesus' command for disciples to make disciples. One of the ways we will do this is through church plants here, near and far. Which '10' speaks to you most personally and why?
7. We believe God calls us to 'GO' but we also acknowledge that for most of us there is a journey of learning, understanding and engaging in what God tells us to do. So, what would be helpful to ignite a desire to engage in one of these '10' initiatives for you personally or the church at large?
8. What stood out to you about the story of Brother John from Syria?
9. What do you think God will do in and through you and us if we go and tell others about Jesus?
