Profile of a Leader

Now this was John's testimony when the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him who he was. He did not fail to confess, but confessed freely, "I am not the Messiah." They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." Finally they said, "Who are you? Give us an answer to take back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" John replied in the words of Isaiah the prophet, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord.'" Now the Pharisees who had been sent questioned him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" "I baptize with water," John replied, "but among you stands one you do not know. He is the one who comes after me, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie." This all happened at Bethany on the other side of the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

Unstoppable #4 – The Profile of a Leader

1. When you think about how God spoke to you through this Sunday's message: What are some thoughts that come to mind?
2. Do you consider yourself to be a leader? Take a minute to reflect on that question together. Why did you answer that way?
3. Leadership is influence: React to that statement. Do you agree or disagree? How do you apply that?
4. Think about your circles of influence. Who are the people, and what are the things (cultures, systems, etc) that you can influence as a result of where God has you?
 - a. Family & close friends: Who are the people?

5. Read the scripture from this past message together: John 1:19-28. What sticks out to you most?

6. The mantra: More of Jesus, less of me, for all to believe... Unpack each of these. What are some ways that you are living this, and in what ways is God calling you to live more into this?

More of Jesus.

7. Reach John 3:30 together. What drove John the Baptist to say that out loud – what was his fuel? What's your fuel to say it more and live it more?
8. One of the last things that Brian said is that there will always be a gap between where we are and how we are doing at living out the more of Jesus, less of me, for all to believe conviction. That's where God's grace comes in to help us.
 - What makes up your "gap" between where you are and where you want to be?
 - How is God's grace helping you currently?
 - How could you look to him more for help?
 - How can this group of people help?
