Crucial Conversation: Leaving a Lasting Impact

February 3, 2019

1. Zac opened with a story of someone encouraging him to have a big impact, one that lasts beyond years. Have you ever had one of these conversations? With whom did you converse? How did it make you feel?
2. When thinking about leaving an impact, one that lasts beyond your years, what do you think is the greatest hindrance you experience?
3. One of the things that it takes to make a lasting impact is to embrace our calling. We defined calling as a unique impact we have on this world. What is it that you feel you can uniquely leave or impact on this world?
4. Often, we have a difficult time defining calling. One of the ways to clarify calling is to say it's the intersection between **skills**, **opportunities** and a **broken-heart**:
 - a. What skills do you have?
 - b. What opportunities lie before you?
 - c. What is it that breaks your heart or stirs your passion?
5. The second part we talked about is that it takes a companion to leave an impact. We said a companion is one who impacts another through invitation and inspiration. **Read Acts 11:19-26**. What do you see in terms of Barnabas' actions towards Paul? What did he do well?
6. When have you been invited and inspired by someone to do something that stretched and challenged you?
7. We also had the opportunity to hear from David Nelms, the president and founder of the Timothy Initiative. He shared how there has been a global impact from church planting in the last year. What was something that stirred you in his update?
8. One of the phrases we have coined at Westwood is "who's your next?" Its identifying someone in your circle, on your team, in your group who you can pour into to be your next. Who is someone personally who you can pour into, be it a neighbor, a teammate, a groupmate? Make it a priority to pray for this person this week.
9. The third part of the message addressed how leaving an impact takes a commitment, namely pouring yourself out to fill others up. At the root of leaving a lasting impact is to serve. **Read 2 Timothy 4: 5-7**. How do you see Paul serving Timothy?
10. We talked about how making an impact takes a calling, a companion and a commitment.
 - a. Of these three, which one do you feel you'd like to take a greater step towards? Why?
 - b. These are just three things we see in the life of Paul. Can you think of any other things that it takes to leave an impact?
