In Acts 1:8 He said, “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” Our ten-year vision (10/10/10) is bold, but God has not called us to be comfortable, but to be bold and, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to reach people with His love!

By the giving of His Son, God set out a bold vision of reaching all people with His love. How? By using willing people who act in faith, trusting that God will provide what is needed to spread the good news of His redeeming love. 2000 years ago He used carpenters, tax collectors and fishermen to spread the Gospel through the ancient world. Today the Gospel reaches the ends of the earth. God’s love is known and experienced by people from the most remote jungles in Africa, to the busy metropolitan centers of China, to the tip of Argentina. The truth of God’s Word exploded in the first century and continues to spread throughout the world.

The 10/10/10 vision that God has placed on our hearts is ridiculously bold – 10 churches, multisites or microsites in 10 years? This will require full participation from everyone at Westwood. 100 immigrant churches or small groups in the Twin Cities? The middle 10 is really 100 multicultural churches helped or started within the Twin City metro area. We are partnering with Merge Twin Cities to reach out to the 1,000,000 first or second-generation immigrants from over 100 nations that God has brought to the Twin Cities. The last 10 is helping to start 1,000 or more churches in the least-reached areas of the world through partnering with strategic organizations.

We celebrate God’s favor in ministry (details are in this report) and believe He will provide the time, talents and resources to see people saved for eternity through Westwood’s bold vision to reach our local communities, the greater Twin Cities area, and the entire world with the love He lavished on us in His Son Jesus Christ. Will you join us and experience the power of God working through the local church, here, near and far?

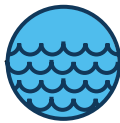

Preschool

150 kids ages 33 months – 5 years are enrolled in the Westwood Preschool programs where they receive a solid foundation in faith and learning. More than half of the students enrolled are from outside the Westwood community.

Westwood is working with Dr. John Mayer of City Vision to establish a ministry center of strategic partners focused on reaching out to immigrants in the Twin Cities area. The ministry partners would lease space in the Bush Lake facility, allowing for synergistic cooperation as we work together to reach the Twin Cities for Christ.

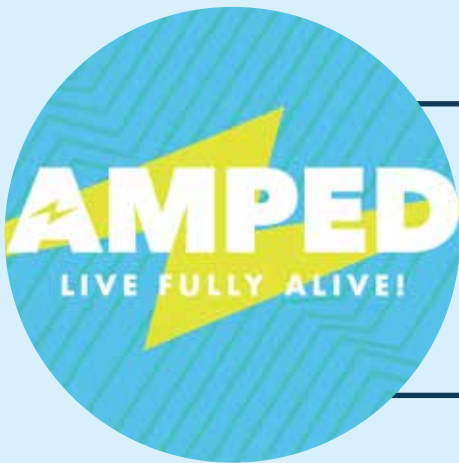

In October 2017, Westwood's Team World Vision had 14 participants who raised a total of \$46,820, bringing clean water for life to more than 935 people. This year, the team has grown to 27 participants.

Over 200 people attended the World Vision Global 6K event, which was a collaboration between 4 churches (Westwood, Westbrook, Oakwood and Trinity Lutheran). This event raised \$10,452, bringing sustainable clean water to 209 people for life.

\$8,500

Kids at VBS raised \$8,500 over just 4 days to buy Cru backpacks filled with school supplies that are given to kids in need.

Hope Garden

The Hope Garden doubled in size, and Westwood preschoolers helped to sprout plants for the garden. Produce grown in the Hope Garden not only fed the residents at the Hope House but was donated to the local food shelf.

Christmas Eve Offering

As is our tradition, we've given away the entire offering to meet the needs of "the least of these." Christmas Eve 2017 brought our largest ever offering with over **\$311,000** raised. We were able to bless organizations here, near and far. This included disaster relief efforts (domestic and international), helping newly arrived refugees in the Twin Cities through Arrive Ministries, and rescuing children from slavery in Ghana through International Justice Mission.

Collection Drives

Hope for the Holidays allowed us to gift area families in need with **\$36,000** worth of gifts.

5+ carloads of goods were collected for organizations like New Life Family Services and Cru InnerCity during Garden of New Beginnings. These items were distributed through the organizations to local families in need.

\$3.7 million

Our congregation is excited about what God is doing in the next 10 years! \$3.7 million was pledged for new initiatives in the 10-10-10 vision. 46% of respondents took a step up the giving ladder.

Open Hands Foundation

Bob Chatmas was hired in May as the first Executive Director of our Open Hands Foundation, which helps meet needs of the vulnerable in our community. The Foundation oversees the Hope House on our Chanhassen Campus, which provided temporary shelter and/or services to more than 450 youth.

Cafe & Food Service Donations



Ever wonder what happens to food left over from Westwood events? Our Cafe and Food Service Ministry donates leftover food to His House Ministry, who then gives food to people in need in our community.

Minnetonka Campus

We're now into our third year of being a multisite church, having launched Westwood Minnetonka in February of 2016. Kevin Christian, our Family Ministries Pastor, came on board this past winter and is leading efforts to grow our student ministry impact at Minnetonka. At Westwood Minnetonka:

- 82 people are involved in 7 groups, representing 48% of average worship attendance
- 164 members are on 12 serve teams engaging 96% of average worship attendance
- Outreach teams served at Beacon Hill Presbyterian Homes, ICA, Minnetonka Police Department and in the Minnetonka School District.

Bush Lake Campus

Pastor Zac Bush has been developing the core team that will launch the Bush Lake campus in November. A strong group of leaders are filling out the ministry teams and small groups that will bring this campus to life and impact the Bloomington/Edina and east Eden Prairie region for Christ. Paid internship and residency leadership programs were launched last year as part of expanding our leadership capacity and building into the next generation. The program expanded this year, and interns are now a part of worship, adult ministry, student ministry, kids ministry and video production.

The Student Worship Band (SWB) helps students grow musically and spiritually, and gives them experience leading worship at student ministry events and other venues. This is the 2nd year of SWB. 24 students are being mentored and leading worship.



Church Plants and Immigrant Outreach

38 churches have been planted in Asia through Westwood's partnership with The Timothy Initiative (Disciples Making Disciples).

Westwood partners with Merge for training in ethnic and immigrant outreach in the Southwest Metro.

Westwood volunteers are working with Global Harvest Church to help with immigrant outreach.

Technology

Our technology infrastructure continues to be updated and expanded to support the ten-year vision. We upgraded the AV infrastructure in our 15-year-old Worship Center at Chanhassen and replaced some aging IT equipment as well. We are also upgrading the video signal pipeline to the Minnetonka campus to ensure seamless delivery of messages.

We expanded our AV staff and have a terrific team of professionals that, together with volunteers, support our worship services and special events on two campuses (soon to be a third), as well as our online ministry.

Chanhassen

The Next Gen area is being updated with security doors and a new look. Parking lot and sidewalk repairs were made. Exploratory and preparatory work is in process to repair our outside terraces.

Minnetonka

A design refresh is in process at the Minnetonka site .

A new student space has been created at our Minnetonka office called “The Warehouse” that includes a stage, upgraded lighting and fun furniture to create an inviting venue for students and their friends. It can also be used for special events.

Bush Lake

A new campus location was selected, designs were created and initial modifications to the space were made. Construction began late summer and all furniture and equipment is being purchased in time for the campus launch later this fall.

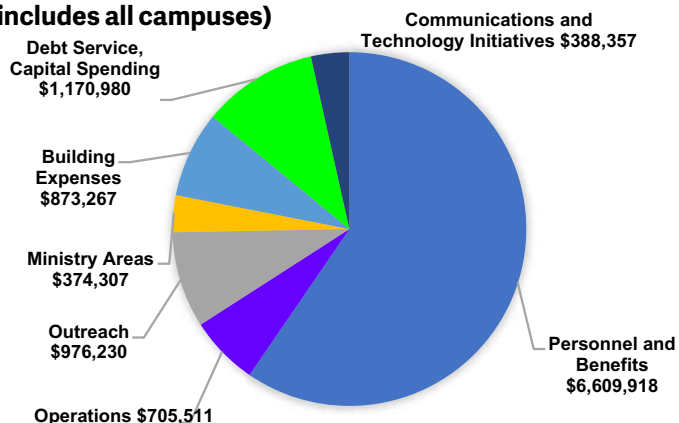
