SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

1. Who is a neighbor in your life's journey that had a really positive influence in your life and who is a neighbor that you would have just preferred they not be?
2. Read the parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10:25-37.
3. When you see someone who needs help, what prompts you to act? What keeps you from helping? At the moment, what seems more important than meeting that person's need?
4. The lavishness of love poured out was in this story is the Samaritan's willingness to Open his eyes, heart, his hands, his wallet, and his calendar. How do you see this expressed in the story itself? As we look over the ways God wants us to open ourselves to the needs around us, which one is the biggest struggle for you?
5. How do you personally answer the question, "Who is your neighbor?" And how does Jesus response impact your understanding?
6. As Westwood moves forward with our 10-10-10 vision it involves invitation for us to proximate with people of different ethnic orientation. What does this parable mean to us a church as we step into places we have not gone before? Why is it important. What makes it hard?
