John 4:1-42

SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

1. Read John 4:1-42.
2. What do you 'thirst' for in your life, or put it another way, in what arena of your life are you in need and 'thirst' or long for something to meet that need and satisfy that thirst?
3. Review Sunday's sermon notes. What part of this passage most challenges, puzzles, or encourages you?
4. What does the offer of living water spoken of in this passage refer to? What do we learn about Jesus in this passage? What does it mean to have his 'water' satisfy 'my thirst'?
5. Read Psalm 42:1; Isaiah 55:1; Jeremiah 2:13; 17:13; Revelation 21:6; 22:1, 17. How do these verses expand on Jesus' statement about "living water"?
6. How does the woman respond to this encounter? What do you think her demeanor was when she told people about her encounter? What did she say? What can we learn from Jesus' conversation with the Samaritan woman that can help us in our witnessing? What other lessons on evangelism do we find in this passage?
7. Choose one of these two questions for reflection: a) How might Jesus' living water meet your 'thirst' need identified in Question 2? B) If Jesus satisfied your thirst, then what would motivate you to go and share the message the way the Samaritan woman did? What might that look like?
