### What is the “Kaboom” movement about?

**The Vision:** To joyfully engage in a life of disciple-making, gospel-sharing, and church-planting Here, Near and Far.

*Acts 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.*

### The Multiplication Strategy: 10-10-10

**10 Here** – By 2028 we will, by faith, plant 10 new churches, multi-sites or microsites in order to bring the healing presence of Jesus into our surrounding communities.

**10 Near (10 x 10 = 100)** – By 2028 we will, by faith, partner with Twin Cities churches and indigenous leaders to plant 100 churches within the growing immigrant population.

**10 Far (10 x 10 x 10 = 1000)** – We will, by faith, partner with TTI and other mission partners to plant 1000 churches among unreached people groups.

Small Group Questions

1. Read John 4:39-42. What was the outcome of Jesus' encounter with the woman at the well after returning to her village and telling others about her experience? What caused them to believe? What encounter did you have with Jesus that caused you to believe?
2. What does the word 'KABOOM' refer to in the context of the church? Churches that adapt to changing times have greater opportunity to reach new people with the healing presence of Jesus. Joel shared this question:

*How do you lead ...  
When everything ahead of you ...  
Is nothing at all like ...  
Anything behind you?*

Where is the question pertinent in the changing realities of your own life and work? Where does it fit within the context of the church's desire to reach the next generation of people?

3. We have cast a ten-year vision for Westwood: To joyfully engage in a life of disciple-making, gospel-sharing, and church-planting Here, Near and Far. It's roots are rooted deep in Jesus' words from **Acts 1:8** *But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."*
  - What do you think happens when we personally, as individuals, say 'yes' or 'no' to Jesus' words?
  - What do you think happens when we collectively as his church says 'yes' or 'no' to Jesus' words?
4. Our current strategy is called 10-10-10. God is moving in great ways in each '10' – Here, Near and Far. Review each definition and answer the following questions.
  - When Pastor Joel gave the update of each '10' which story or example encouraged you the most in terms of how God is working Here, Near and Far?
  - Which '10' resonates most with you and your gifts and interests? If none of them resonate with you, why? and how can you begin to nurture in your own heart and mind a desire to engage in one of the '10' strategic arenas.
- ✓ **10 Here** – By 2028 we will, by faith, plant 10 new churches, multi-sites or microsities in order to bring the healing presence of Jesus into our surrounding communities.
- ✓ **10 Near (10 x 10 = 100)** – By 2028 we will, by faith, partner with Twin City churches and indigenous leaders to plant 100 churches within the growing immigrant population. (The Tamil service launch and Sammy Wanyonyi's Merge mission)
- ✓ **10 Far (10 x 10 x 10=1000)** – We will, by faith, partner with TTI and other mission partners to plant 1000 churches among unreached people groups (David Nelms)
5. Brainstorm ways that you could "proximate" or draw near to those who have yet to receive the healing presence and power of Jesus Here, Near, or Far. Conclude your time in prayer for each '10' focus.
