Group Questions

1. We may not all be Dads, but we all have had Dads. We often celebrate dads on Father's Day by giving gifts. The most common gifts are related to fashion and outings. Share a memory about a Father's Day gift you have given or received.
2. The message this Sunday kicked off with an interview of a dad from Westwood named Jim Larson. What was one take away as you listened to that interview?
3. The verses from the message focus on Proverbs, a book that teaches wisdom and discipline for our daily lives. Our relationships with our fathers can be great but for some they can be very challenging. Discuss your relationship with your dad and how your relationship with God the Father has shaped your relationship with your Dad.

4. The Proverbs verses speak about what *to give* and *not to give* your father.

What *not* to give your father:

Don't give him foolishness

Proverbs 17:21, 25; Proverbs 19:13

Don't rob him

Proverbs 19:26; Proverbs 28: 24

Don't mock him

Proverbs 30:17

What *to* give your father:

Give him honor

Deuteronomy 5:16

Listen to him

Proverbs 1:8; Proverbs 4:1; 23:22

Show him what's right and wise

Proverbs 23:24

Read these verses together as a group. Discuss what this could look like for you as you apply this to your life. If your father is no longer here, how can these verses be of impact to your life?

5. **Proverbs 30:17** talks about "the eye that mocks a father" . Read this verse together. Dad's are often the ones who get made fun of. There are "Dad Jokes", "Dad Jeans" and many other ways that society pokes fun of dads. We should instead be honoring our fathers. **Deuteronomy 5:16.** *Honor your father and your mother, as the LORD your God has commanded you, so that you may live long and that it may go well with you in the land the LORD your God is giving you.* How can you honor your Dad? Unpack this verse as a group.
6. **Proverbs 1:8, Proverbs 4:1 and 23:22** all talk about listening to your father. What have you personally learned, what wisdom have you gained from your earthly father? What have you learned from listening to God the Father? How do you "listen" to God the Father?
7. The message is titled "Father's Day Gifts". Our dads here on earth have given us life, but God the Father calls us into new life and the gift of salvation. A gift that has been given to you through Christ. Have you received this gift? What is holding you back from this gift? How has this gift changed how you live your life?
